2. Athletic Director Report

3. Officer Election

Open position for May 17 meeting - Co - VP. Leigh Vaughn will be stepping down as her son will be graduating. This position pays out \$500 to your team after the year ends.

4. Treasurer Report

Jodi K. provided us with the updated financial report. Our account is healthy at \$42,460.17. Still need to payout holiday hustle and sales tax.

Working with Dexter parent on tax preparation. We pay 6% tax quarterly.

Holiday Hustle paid out \$140 per sport team participant for a total of \$2,240.

Question on concession payout: We get 35% off the top of concession revenue then divide it among the volunteers for their teams. We cap the amount per person at \$45 so that we can make sure on slower, less business, we offer minimum of \$15.



Unfortunately, we did not get any money from the food trucks this year - that money went directly to the touchdown club.

A few questions about creating individual team clubs: DCS discourages teams from having their own booster club. Club sports have a different arrangement. And football has their own 501c3 touchdown club.

When money is raised with ABCD, the money is deposited into your team's account. Team's can spend their money on things like uniforms, field management, etc. Reps are encouraged to speak to their coaches and the Athletic Dept for more information.

Still looking for ways to go cashless this spring. One option is Zero Touch. Would need a paypal account and dedicated phones at the concessions.

If we go cashless we can benefit by:

- tracking all our data and inventory

- spot trends in purchasing

This could be very costly to have phones and data plans for football field, gym, and soccer fields for fall.

Leigh motioned to approve the financial report. Laurie second.

5. Concessions Report

Fall concessions total payout for 2022 was \$12,465. In 2021, this number was \$7,428. The extra football games was one reason the number was higher.
